Category 2 contains significant contamination requiring protective equipment during restoration. Category 3 presents severe biological hazard with fecal matter, sewage, or environmental pathogens. Category 1, known as clean water, originates from sanitary sources. A burst supply line, broken water main, or overflowing bathtub creates Category 1 damage. This water contains no significant contaminants and poses minimal health risk during initial contact. However, Category 1 can degrade into Category 2 within 24–48 hours if not dried properly, because standing water begins collecting bacteria and microbial growth. Common Category 2 sources include washing machine overflow, dishwasher failure, toilet overflow from urine only, or water backup from clean portions of a residential drain system. The critical distinction lies in the contamination threshold: the water contains pathogens and irritants that demand respiratory protection, gloved handling, and containment strategies during extraction and drying.

Category 2 classification triggers specific protocols because exposure risk elevates significantly. 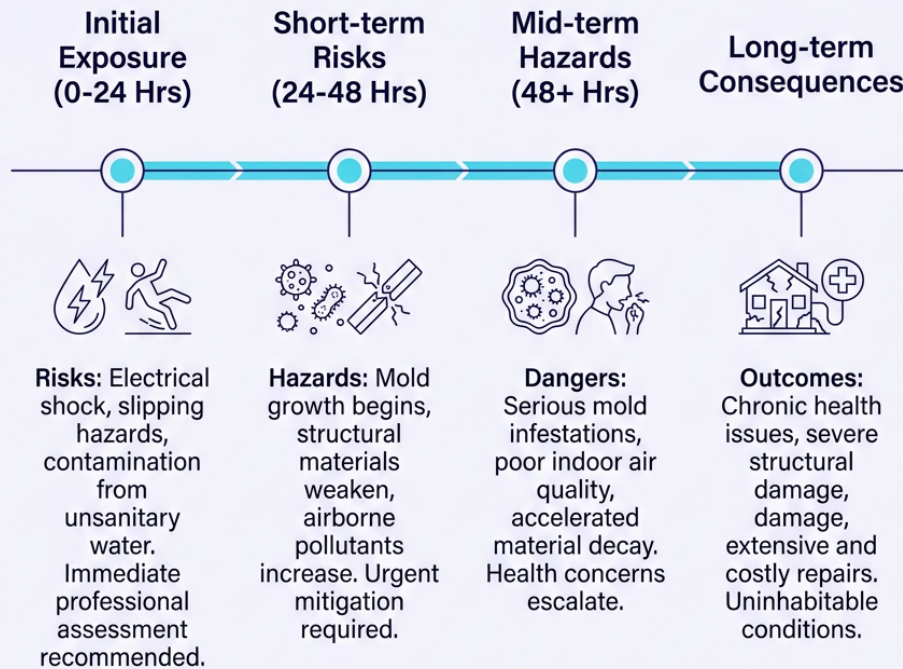
