Concrete: when it assists, when it hurts

Concrete around a fencing blog post can increase security by developing a difficult "outlet," but it can likewise create issues if it's done without considering water motion and soil interface.

Here are the compromises I've seen play out:

- In very soft or sandy ground, concrete can avoid a blog post from tottering as dirt compresses.
- In responsive clay, concrete can become the inflexible component that combats motion, which often brings about splits in the surrounding backfill and more activity over time.
- If concrete is put and the gap between article and dirt is not addressed thoroughly, water courses can create, and the base can cycle with damp and dry states faster than you expect.

The "ideal" technique depends on the ground. Some Fence contractors concentrate greatly on concrete, others push for minimal concrete with crafted backfill. The ideal fence installer will determine based on dirt stability, drain, and the anticipated movement at the blog post base.

Backfill is not just dirt

Good backfill technique has to do with:

- providing firm support around the message,
- limiting spaces that allow the message work out later on,
- promoting drain instead of holding water versus the base.

In lots of soil types, compressed granular product performs much better than loose fill. If you've ever enjoyed a newly built fence after a heavy rainfall, you may see a mild sinking at the post line once the ground resolves. That's usually the soil and backfill doing what they were never allowed to do properly: compact.

Drainage: the unnoticeable cause of leaning
