No 2 skins are completely identical, thanks to the Float Value system. A float worth is a decimal number between **0.00 and 1.00** that identifies how worn or battle-scarred a skin looks.

Wear Category	Drift Value Range	Visual Characteristics
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Beautiful, minimal to no scratches or blemishes.
Minimal Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Very minor wear, typically near the edges or high-friction locations.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious scratches, scuffs, and fading. Most typical category.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Considerable wear, heavy scratching, and obvious paint loss.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Seriously weathered, in some cases totally changing the weapon's appearance.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not drop in Factory New condition (e.g., the AWP|Asiimov maxes out at Field-Tested).

StatTrak™ and Souvenirs

Players can likewise acquire unique versions of skins:

- **StatTrak™**: Features an LCD counter embedded in the weapon that tracks the number of kills made with that particular item.
- **Keepsake**: Dropped exclusively during official Valve-sponsored esports competitions (Majors), featuring gold sticker labels of the groups and MVP of the round.

The CS2 Skin Economy: Why Do They Cost So Much?

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is greatly driven by supply and need. Due to the fact that skins are acquired mostly through random drops, opening weapon cases with secrets, or trading, uncommon items command staggering costs. Some legendary knives and rare-patterned rifles have actually cost numerous thousands of dollars.



Several aspects determine the worth of a CS2 skin:
