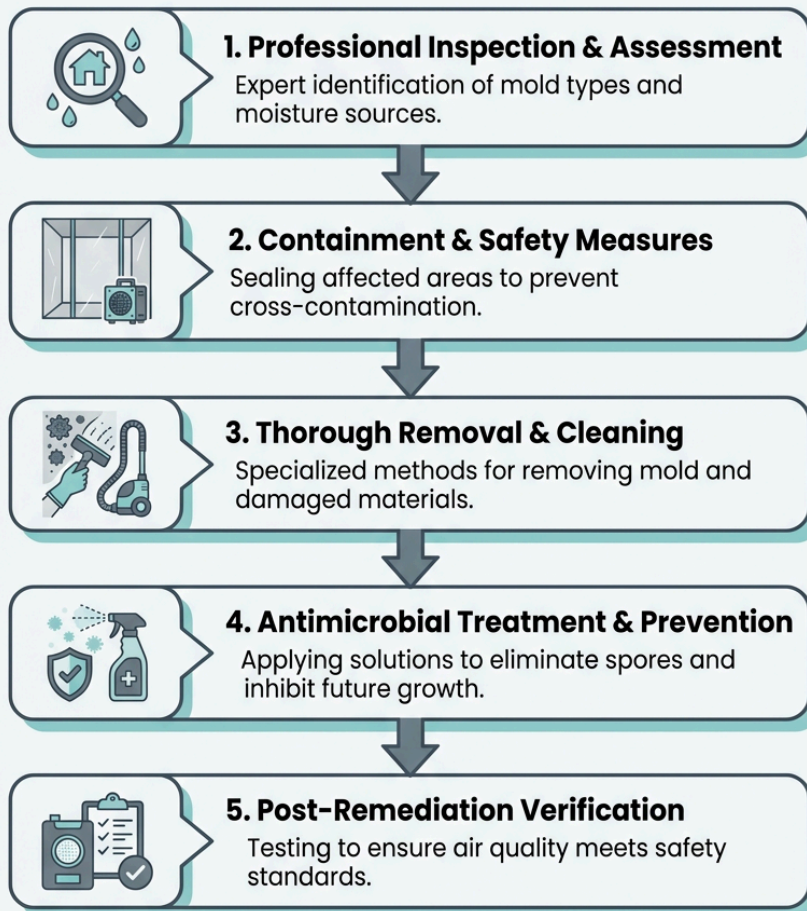
Why do attic and crawl space costs define a separate threshold?
