- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07
- **Very Little Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00
