: GO Cases: A Deep Dive into the Game's Most Coveted Loot Boxes

Covert (Red)~ 0.26%  
Rare Special Item (Yellow)~ 0.02%

*Note: Exact odds can differ from case to case; some newer cases change likelihoods a little to reflect market demand.*



## Popular Cases and Their Economics

\* ROI (Return on Investment) is determined as the average resale value of the rarest skin divided by the overall expense of the case plus key, revealed as a percentage.

## Factors Influencing Case Value
