- **Jackpot:** Multiple players deposit skins into a single pot. The greater the value of a gamer's deposit, the higher their statistical possibility of winning the whole built up pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on professional CS2 matches (e.g., ESL Pro League, Majors) using virtual balance or skins, anticipating match winners, map ratings, or specific in-game events.

Keep in mind: Due to Steam trade holds (a 7-day trade limitation positioned on freshly traded products), withdrawing physical skins can often require waiting a week before the item is tradable again.

Best Practices for Safety and Security
