Heat pump systems, increasingly popular for their dual heating and cooling capability, fall into similar ranges but may trend \$1,000 to \$2,000 higher due to advanced refrigerant handling and control systems. Additionally, emergency replacement during peak cooling season (June through August) costs 10 to 20 percent more than off-season replacement because technician availability is tight and demand surges. Cost data shows that homeowners who plan replacement in spring or fall save 15 to 25 percent compared to summer emergency replacement.
