- Over the years, Valve has actually executed trade lock durations (avoiding newly traded skins from being traded once again for seven days) to curb automatic bot trading utilized by gambling sites.
- Regardless of these procedures, operators continuously discover technical workarounds, such as using peer-to-peer (P2P) trading systems or shifting deals completely to cryptocurrency.
