

Ellicott City has a way of getting under your skin. The first time many people drive down Main Street, they notice the steep grade, the stone storefronts, and the narrow road that seems to fold into the hillside. It feels older than it is, and more lived-in than curated. That impression is part of the town's appeal.
