

The roof edge is the line your eye already follows

Look at any house after dark and the shape you recognize is the roofline. Nothing else on the house gives you that much unbroken length, and nothing else has the sky behind it. Light that line and the whole house resolves. That is the reason permanent systems live at the roof edge, and the reason a single run there does more than fixtures scattered around the yard. It is the most efficient piece of exterior lighting a house can have, measured by what it changes for what it takes.

What is up there

The system is a slim aluminum track, matched to your trim color, carrying LEDs along the roof edge. The channel does two jobs at once: it aims the light and it conceals the hardware. Because it matches the trim, you generally have to be told where it is.

Not every edge needs it

Every plan begins at the main roofline, and grows from there. After the [christmas light installation](#) main line come the peaks, the entry and the porch roof, added only where it adds something. Lighting every edge on a house flattens it. Look along a completed run from one end, because a line that stays true over that distance is the mark of a careful install.

The noon test

A roofline system is on the house every day, lit or unlit. That is why the channel gets matched to your trim rather than sold in one color. Mount it tight to the edge, match the color, and route the wire out of sight, and nothing about the daylight view changes.

One line, several jobs

After install the system runs from your phone. Plain white most nights, holiday color when the calendar calls for it, on a timer so nobody has to remember. Most owners land on one white and leave it, using color for the handful of days that call for it.

Why quotes vary

Rooflines do not scale with house size. Linear feet is the first one, though it is rarely what separates two quotes. Every direction change adds time. Height is the other one, because a second or third story changes the equipment and the time.

Does it attach to the gutter?

Homeowners assume the lights clip to the gutter, since that is how the temporary version goes up. A permanent channel is a different arrangement. That distinction matters because gutters move, sag and get replaced, and anything fastened to one inherits its problems.

Because every roof edge is different, a real answer needs a visit. What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?
