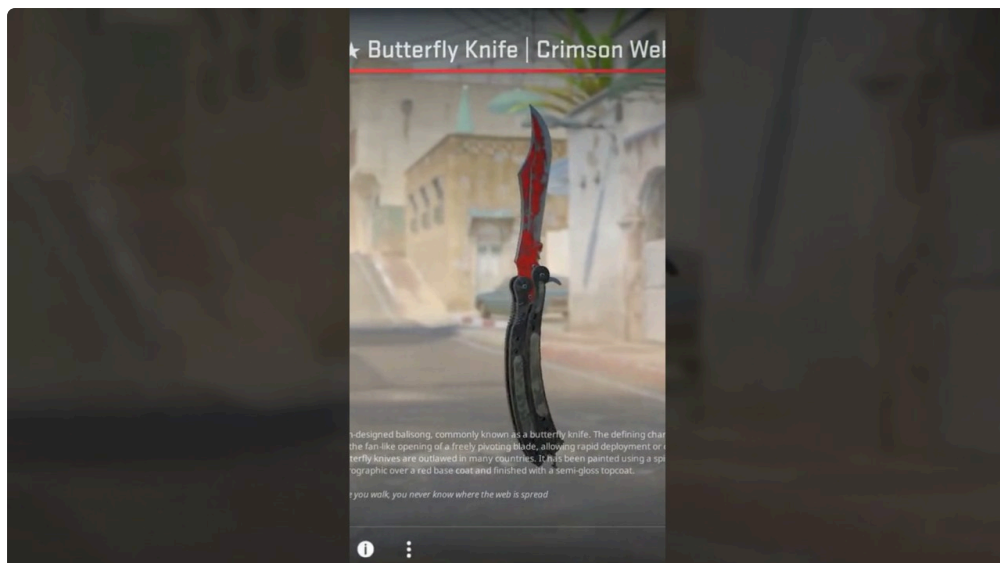
Popular Cases and Their Contents
