

Medford has always sat in that interesting middle ground between old Long Island and the newer, faster-moving suburbs that grew around it. It is not a place that announces itself with one skyline-defining landmark or a neatly packaged downtown district. Instead, its character comes from layers, from roads that predate the traffic on them, from neighborhoods that filled in over time, from businesses that came and went, and from the constant maintenance that keeps houses, storefronts, and civic buildings looking cared for.
