3. Prime Status Benefits

As mentioned, having Prime Status is non-negotiable for major gamers wanting to make totally free items. Prime gamers are matched with other Prime users (reducing cheater encounters) and are solely eligible for weekly care bundles that include important weapon cases and random skin drops.

4. Significant Tournaments and View Passes

Throughout Valve-sponsored CS2 Major championships, viewers can buy or in some cases earn Souvenir Packages.

- By watching the competition live by means of the Steam television or in-game client, or by taking part in the Pick 'Em Challenge using a Viewer Pass, gamers can make Souvenir Cases specific to that competition.
- These cases do not need a crucial to open, making them 100% complimentary value once obtained.

Alternative Methods: External Sites (Proceed with Caution)

Many third-party websites promote "free CS: GO cases" through sign-up perks, promo codes, or daily rewards. While some of these platforms are genuine community-trusted trading or betting sites, players need to exercise severe caution.
