

Why Does My Murrieta Home Have Hard Water Stains Those chalky white deposits building up around faucets, showerheads, and glass shower doors are a direct result of the mineral content naturally present in Murrieta's water supply. Calcium and magnesium, the two minerals primarily responsible for water hardness, do not evaporate the way water itself does, leaving behind a visible residue everywhere water regularly sits or drips. The Murrieta Valley sits in a part of Southern California where groundwater and imported supply both tend to carry higher mineral content than areas with naturally softer water, which is why hard water stains here are often more stubborn than what homeowners may have dealt with in other parts of the country.

Laundry can come out looking dingier and feeling stiffer than it would with softened water, since mineral deposits interfere with how detergent works during the wash cycle.
