4. Jackpot/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple players deposit skins into a collective pot. Each skin contributes tickets based upon its dollar worth. A random draw chooses a winner, where a higher total contribution yields a greater statistical possibility of winning the entire pot.
- **Appeal:** The ultimate "high-roller" video game mode, where single lucky winners can win countless dollars in unusual digital items.

The Economics of Skin Trading and Withdrawal
