- **Pattern Index:** A seed number (from 1 to 1000) that identifies how a texture is mapped onto a weapon. For certain skins, a particular pattern can position a rare design component-- like blue on a Case Hardened knife-- in prime visibility.
- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An optional counter developed into the weapon that digitally tape-records the variety of kills the owner accomplishes with it.
- **Souvenir Quality:** Items dropped exclusively during main Valve-sponsored esports tournaments (Majors), including gold sticker labels commemorating the match and groups.

The Wear Rating Hierarchy

Understanding skin wear is vital for anybody aiming to purchase, sell, or trade. The wear condition is divided into five unique classifications:

Exterior Condition	Float Value	Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00--	0.07	Pristine condition with minimal to no scratches or blemishes.
Minimal Wear (MW)	0.07--	0.15	Very light wear, typically little scratches noticeable only upon close inspection.
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15--	0.38	Visible wear and tear, scratches on the body and paint chipping on edges.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38--	0.45	Considerable wear, heavy scratching, and obvious fading of colors.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45--	1.00	Incredibly worn, greatly faded, rusted, or scraped appearance.
