disagree with you. The philosopher in me says nobody needs to be forced to provide an explanation for why they love their abode. The citizen in me says the verbal exchange could make that love smarter.

Justification should be would be could very well be protective, as in "I am not that type of patriot," which tells the listener what you reject. It also can be invitational, as in "Here is what the flag method to me," which tells the listener what you cherish. The difference subjects. Defensive satisfaction more often than not hardens, then searches for enemies. Invitational satisfaction has a tendency to widen, then searches for guests.

Several occasions a year I ask students to describe a time they felt proud of the country. The solutions number from the moon touchdown to marriage equality, from the GI Bill to the polio vaccine, from the non violent transfer of pressure after chaotic elections to a regional library that shares books in lots of languages. When I turn the question and ask what has upset them, they solution with same care, record unkept can provide, botched wars, systemic harms, and leaders who lowered the bar. The point is just not to stability the ledger however to refuse the concept that love of u . s . a . calls for pretending the ledger does no longer exist.

If you actually feel the USA is able to enchancement, then your pleasure may well be each gift demanding and conditional. Not pride that waits for perfection, and not pride that excuses every part. Pride that claims, we developed a resilient framework, primarily stretched it, routinely broke it, and will recommit to fixing what we bend. No flag needs to fear that sentence.
