

Garage doors in Los Angeles experience everyday operation, sun exposure, dust, coastal air, and varied property designs. A detached garage in an older neighborhood may have distinct repair needs than a newer development, hillside property, or attached garage in the San Fernando Valley. If the garage door does not close, examine the photo-eye sensors along the bottom of both sides of the opening. These sensors need to face one another and have a direct line. Dust, cobwebs, moisture, or unintended shifting can disrupt the beam. Heat, dust, and direct sun across the San Fernando Valley and inland Los Angeles can cause sensor obstruction and weather-seal wear. Wipe the lenses carefully and verify that both indicator lights seem normal.

Do not bypass the photo-eye sensors. They are a vital safety feature that is designed to stop the door from closing on a person, pet, or vehicle. If the opener clicks but the door does not move, or if it reverses immediately, the problem may involve the opener's gears, travel limits, force settings, wiring, tracks, or spring system. Why Has My Garage Door Loud, Crooked, or Jammed?

Scraping, squealing, popping, or rattling can indicate worn garage door rollers, loose hardware, dry hinges, or issues affecting the garage door tracks. Track alignment is particularly important. Bent or separated tracks can

cause the door to bind, run crooked, or come off the track. A technician can evaluate whether the tracks need adjustment, fastening, or replacement.

Garage door rollers move the door through the tracks. Steel rollers may become noisy as bearings wear, while older plastic rollers can crack or deform. Garage door balance is another valuable check. With the door closed and disconnected from the opener, a properly balanced door should move smoothly and remain reasonably stable at supported positions. Do not adjust spring tension yourself. A failed balance test indicates that a technician should inspect the spring system, cables, tracks, and door weight.

Keep children away from the opener controls, manual release cord, and moving door. Arrange emergency service if the door is hanging unevenly, has fallen off its tracks, has a broken spring or cable, or cannot secure the garage. Routine garage door maintenance and an annual safety inspection can reduce unexpected failures, but they do not eliminate normal wear.
