| <b>Stammering followed by Crash</b>          | Insufficient RAM or background resource hog     | Close unnecessary background apps through Task Manager |

### Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Guide

If gamers are experiencing frequent crashes, they need to resolve the following troubleshooting steps systematically.

#### 1. Validate the Integrity of Game Files

Over time, game files can become damaged due to failed updates, unexpected power outages, or faulty storage drives. Steam has a built-in tool to inspect and replace missing out on or broken files.

- Open the **Steam Library**.
- Right-click on **Counter-Strike: Global Offensive** and select **Properties**.
- Navigate to the **Installed Files** tab.
- Click **Verify stability of game files**.
- Wait for the process to finish (this may take a few minutes) and restart Steam.

## 2. Update Graphics Drivers

- **For NVIDIA Users:** Open GeForce Experience or visit the main NVIDIA website to download the most current Game Ready Driver.
- **For AMD Users:** Open AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition or examine the official AMD support page.
- *Pro Tip:* If crashes began immediately after a driver update, utilize a tool like **Display Driver Uninstaller (DDU)** in Safe Mode to entirely wipe the old driver before setting up a tidy version.

## 3. Adjust Launch Options

Particular launch choices can require the video game to run in a more stable mode or bypass bothersome intro videos.

To set launch options:

1. Right-click CS: GO in Steam and select **Properties**.
2. Under the **General** tab, find the **Launch Options** text box.
3. Include the following recommended specifications:
  - -novid (Skips the introduction valve video, preventing potential start-up hangs)
  - -high (Sets CS: GO as a high priority procedure for the CPU)
  - -autoconfig (Resets game video and performance settings to default if the video game stops working to boot completely)

## 4. Manage Third-Party Overlays and Background Software

- **Discord Overlay:** Disable the in-game overlay in Discord settings.
- **NVIDIA GeForce Experience:** Turn off the in-game overlay.
- **Third-Party Antivirus:** Temporarily whitelist the CS: GO setup folder or run the video game with Windows Defender to guarantee security suites aren't incorrectly flagging video game files as hazards.

## 5. Look For Hardware Overheating and Overclocking

Competitive players typically press their hardware to the absolute limitation. Nevertheless, unsteady overlocks or thermal throttling can trigger the video game to crash to secure system parts.

- Download hardware tracking software like **HWMonitor** or **MSI Afterburner**.

- Examine CPU and GPU temperature levels while playing casual deathmatch or neighborhood servers. Temperatures above 85 ° C ( 185 ° F ) suggest potential cooling concerns.
- If the CPU or GPU is manually overclocked, revert the clock speeds to factory defaults to check if stability returns.

## Preventative Maintenance Checklist

To minimize the opportunities of future crashes, gamers should maintain a healthy system routine. Consider embracing the following best practices:

- **Clean out physical dust** from PC fans and heat sinks every 3-- 6 months.
- **Keep Windows updated** to the most recent stable construct to guarantee DirectX and visual C++ redistributables are current.
- **Run a disk check (CHKDSK)** occasionally to make sure the storage drive real estate CS: GO has no bad sectors.
- **Avoid alt-tabbing excessively** during packing screens, as this is a notorious trigger for Source engine crashes.

Handling a CS: GO crash can be deeply aggravating, but systemic troubleshooting almost always reveals the root cause. By beginning with simple software repairs-- such as verifying game files and updating motorists-- and approaching hardware and background application checks, players can bring back stability to their system.
