

Lindenhurst sits in a part of Long Island that feels familiar and specific at the same time. You can tell, even after a short drive through the village, that this is a place shaped by salt air, side streets, front porches, and the practical rhythms of suburban coastal life. It has the kind of everyday character that people who live here recognize instantly, but visitors often miss if they only pass through on the way to the beach or the train.
