

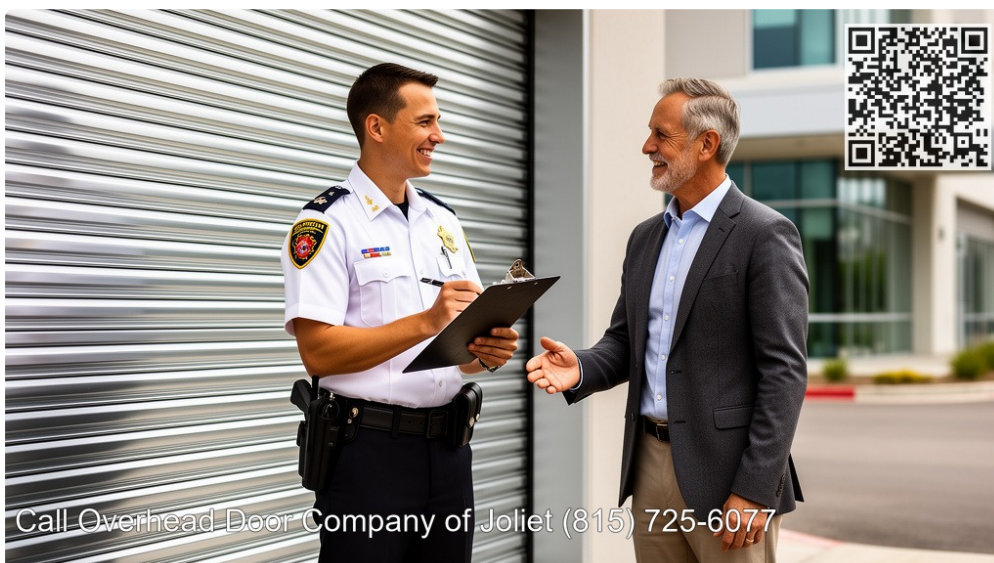

Picking the right door for the work, not just the spec

Rolling steel fire doors fit several opening security instances in mixed-occupancy buildings. Insulated sectional doors offer hefty biking requirements and energy efficiency. High-performance textile doors appeal where rate issues, such as energetic parking garages with limited ramps. Three Chicago stories that clarify our approach

A circulation hub near O'Hare exchanged out 2 aging fire-rated rolling doors that separated the dock from the finished-goods corridor. The original doors were hefty, manual-only devices that nobody wanted to [same-day residential service](#) test. Examinations developed into stressful afternoons. We changed them with mechanized, identified 3-hour doors with guvs and electric releasing tools linked into the center's FACP. Door dimension was 14 feet by 12 feet, with protected slats and guide weatherstripping. We included local horn strobes at each side and an annunciated push-to-open after decline, coordinated with the fire security engineer. Throughout commissioning, the plant supervisor watched a complete decrease examination from initiation to reset. The reset procedure took under four minutes. A year later, their NFPA 80 annual examination log shows absolutely no failures, and their insurance policy carrier noted the improvement in the loss-control report.

On a limited street in Wicker Park, a mixed-use structure required a silent, reliable garage door for occupant auto parking that would certainly not fight the winter season wind. An insulated sectional with a 25,000 cycle springtime would have worked, however traffic matters from the condominium board showed 200 to 300 cycles daily. We updated to a 75,000 cycle spring collection, placed a silent jackshaft operator with a heated control unit, and worked with a draft stop detail at the lintel to shut a pesky 1-inch space lots of people miss. The driver's soft-start ravelled early morning actuations, and the energy loss through that opening dropped noticeably. The building designer called the very first polar vortex after turn over and claimed, just, the entrance hall is cozy for the first time in years.

An auto repair shop in the West Loophole had a seven-foot opening from the bays right into a customer service workdesk, drawn as a rated wall surface. The incorrect item, a basic counter shutter without a tag, showed up from a previous vendor. Their permit review flagged it, and the job delayed. We determined, purchased a classified fire-rated counter door with a 90-minute tag, and mounted a compact launching panel that tied neatly into the existing meddle and waterflow circuits with the emergency alarm specialist. The area was tight, so we made a clean angle structure to prevent exploration right into the demising wall's studs, which the architect wanted unblemished. We then trained staff to reset the door after a drill. The solution relocated the job off redline and earned a tidy final on the initial re-inspection.

Maintenance that in fact protects people

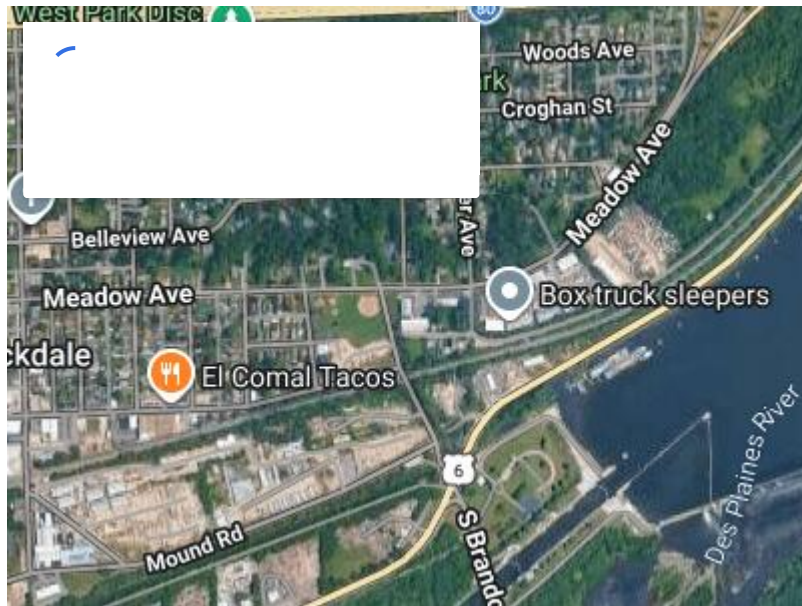
