2. **Third-Party Trading Platforms**-- Sites such as Buff163, Skinport, and Dmarket typically host listings with minor discounts. However, purchasers should validate the platform's credibility to avoid frauds.
3. **In-Game Drops**-- For cases that still occasionally drop (e.g., Chroma 2), players can increase their chances by taking part in official Valve operations or by using active servers. The drop rate remains low, so patience is essential.
4. **Occasion Giveaways**-- Occasionally, Valve or partner tournaments host free gifts where gamers can win an uncommon case. Keeping an eye on official announcements and social networks channels guarantees opportunities are not missed.
