- **Why:** Historical data shows that discontinued cases appreciate significantly over extended periods as the active supply diminishes. However, this requires patience, capital, and storage space in a Steam inventory.

3. The Unboxer (Proceed with Caution)

- **The Play:** Buy keys and open every brand-new case that drops.
- **Why:** Pure home entertainment. Mathematically, opening cases belongs to playing a lottery game with a heavily manipulated home edge. While hitting an unusual knife or hidden skin yields an enormous dopamine hit (and financial return), the huge majority of openings lead to low-tier, low-value weapon finishes.
