

Are termites frequent in Ottawa?

Termites are not the most common pest issue in Ottawa, but they are common enough that homeowners should take them seriously. In Ottawa, Ontario, most people think first about house mice, insects, or winter invaders, but termites can still create an infestation in the right conditions.
