

Catching a Slab Leak Early: One Murrieta Homeowner's Story A homeowner in West Murrieta first noticed something was off when the monthly water bill arrived nearly twice as high as usual, with no obvious explanation, no new pool filling, no unusually long showers, nothing that accounted for the jump. A quick check around the house turned up nothing visible, no dripping faucets, no wet spots on the ceiling, no obvious signs of a leak anywhere. The technician accessed the affected section of pipe, made the repair, and pressure tested the line to confirm the fix held, all without the extensive demolition a more advanced slab leak might have required. The homeowner later reflected that trusting an unusual utility bill enough to investigate, rather than assuming it was simply a billing mistake, likely saved thousands of dollars in avoided foundation and flooring damage. It is exactly the kind of early catch that a slab leak, invisible until it is not, depends on.
