Why the right service has to match the lock

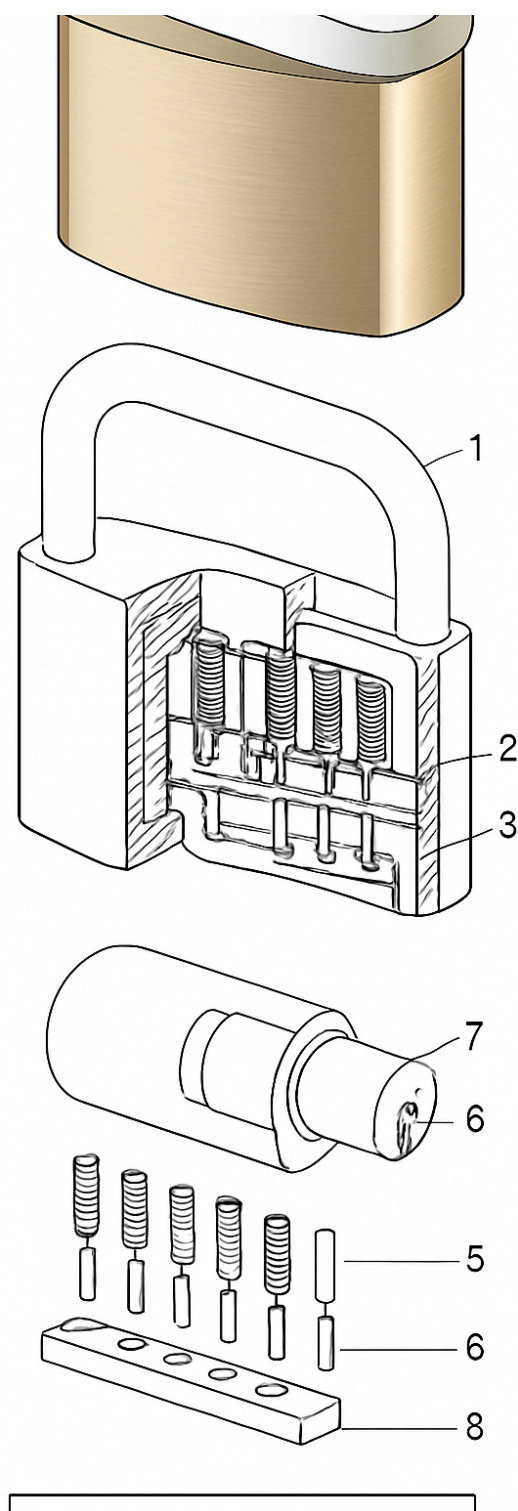
