- **Wear Rating (Float Value):** A mathematical worth between 0.00 and 1.00 that determines how scratched or worn a skin looks. Lower drifts mean cleaner surfaces, though some specific skins really look much better (or are valued higher) with greater wear.
- **Pattern Index:** A seed number (from 1 to 1000) that determines how a texture is mapped onto a weapon. For certain skins, a particular pattern can put an uncommon design component-- like blue on a Case Hardened knife-- in prime visibility.
- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An optional counter built into the weapon that digitally records the number of kills the owner accomplishes with it.
- **Keepsake Quality:** Items dropped exclusively throughout official Valve-sponsored esports competitions (Majors), featuring gold sticker labels honoring the match and groups.

The Wear Rating Hierarchy

Understanding skin wear is important for anybody looking **CS2 Skins** to purchase, sell, or trade. The wear condition is divided into 5 distinct categories:

Exterior Condition Float Value Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Pristine condition with minimal to no scratches or acnes. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Really light wear, usually little scratches noticeable just upon close evaluation. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Noticeable wear and tear, scratches on the body and paint breaking on edges. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Substantial wear, heavy scratching, and visible fading of colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Extremely used, greatly faded, rusted, or scraped appearance.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," suggesting they can not physically drop in Factory New condition since of how the texture is programmed.

The Economics of the CS2 Marketplace

What separates Counter-Strike from most other video games is its open, player-driven economy. Valve produced a virtual community where digital items hold real-world value, sustained by the Steam Community Market and third-party trading platforms.

Elements Driving Skin Prices:

1. **Rarity and Drop Rates:** Just like physical trading cards, the chances of unboxing unusual items (like Covert rifles, knives, or gloves) from weapon cases are extremely low.
2. **Supply and Demand:** If a particular case is no longer dropping in-game, the supply of its consisted of skins becomes finite, often triggering costs to increase with time.
3. **Expert Play (Esports):** When a professional player uses a specific skin during a major competition, need for that product frequently increases overnight.
4. **Trade-Ups:** Players can trade up 10 skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next greater tier, completely taking in the input items and modifying market supplies.
