Quick Diagnostic Checklist

When a crash occurs, gamers ought to not right away turn to re-installing the entire game. Rather, follow this diagnostic list to limit the origin:

1. **Note the Error Message:** Does the video game crash to desktop (CTD) quietly, or does it reveal a particular error code (like engine.dll or memory allotment mistakes)?
2. **Examine System Temperatures:** Overheating CPUs and GPUs will instantly throttle or close down procedures to avoid long-term hardware damage.
3. **Confirm Recent Changes:** Did the crash start occurring instantly after a Windows update, a graphics driver upgrade, or the installation of new peripherals?

Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Solutions

1. Confirm Integrity of Game Files

3. Change Launch Options

4. Disable Fullscreen Optimizations

Windows utilizes an internal function called "Fullscreen Optimizations" to manage borderless windowed modes, which can occasionally interfere with DirectX rendering in older source engine video games.



- **Action 1:** Navigate to the game installation directory (generally C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
- **Step 2:** Locate the primary executable file (csgo.exe).
- **Step 3:** Right-click the file and select **Properties**.
- **Step 4:** Go to the **Compatibility** tab.
- **Step 5:** Check the box for **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.
- **Step 6:** Click *Apply* and *OK*.

Advanced Troubleshooting

If fundamental software repairs fail to fix the crashing issue, the issue may lie deeper within the os or hardware configuration.

Managing Overclocks (CPU, GPU, and RAM)

Many competitive players overclock their hardware to eke out every last frame per second (FPS). Nevertheless, source engines [new CS2 crash sites](#) can be infamously delicate to unstable overclocks.

- If the system has an aggressive CPU or GPU overclock applied through MSI Afterburner or the BIOS, go back the clock speeds back to factory stock settings to evaluate stability.
- **XMP/EXPO Profiles:** Unstable RAM profiles can cause unanticipated video game crashes and memory read errors. Attempt disabling XMP/DOCP in the BIOS momentarily to see if crashes persist.

Running as Administrator

Permissions issues can occasionally prevent the video game from composing required cache files to the storage drive.

- Find csgo.exe, right-click it, select **Properties**, go to the **Compatibility** tab, and check **Run this program as an administrator**.

Re-installing the Game

As a last hope, a tidy reinstallation ensures that no recurring conflicting files from old updates stay. Uninstall the game through Steam, by hand delete any remaining folders in the steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive directory site, and download a fresh copy.
