

A windshield used to be treated like a large piece of glass that kept rain and wind out of the cabin. That was never the whole truth, but it was close enough for many everyday conversations. Modern vehicles have made that view outdated. On many cars, trucks, and SUVs, the windshield is now part of a larger safety system that includes crash protection, airbag performance, roof support, and driver assistance cameras mounted behind the glass.

That changes the way windshield replacement should be handled. A chip or crack in front of a camera is not only a visibility issue. A poorly selected replacement glass, an installation that ignores safety standards, or a missed calibration can affect systems that drivers rely on every day, often without thinking about them. Lane assistance, forward collision alerts, automatic emergency braking, and similar features depend on accurate camera positioning and a clear view through the windshield.

Even small variations can matter because these systems are designed around precise geometry.

That is why vehicles with ADAS cameras often require OEM-equivalent glass during front windshield replacement. OEM windshield replacement is not about a logo for its own sake. The point is compatibility. The replacement windshield must be appropriate for the vehicle's camera and safety systems. A windshield that fits the opening may still be unsuitable if it does not meet the needs of the camera system.

ADAS windshield calibration is the next part of the job. After a windshield is replaced, the camera system must be calibrated so it understands its position and view correctly.
