The Mechanics Behind the Scenes: Provably Fair Gaming

To fight uncertainty and build trust amongst users, respectable CSGO gambling sites carry out a system referred to as **Provably Fair**.

This cryptographic technology allows gamers to individually validate that the result of every video game is really random and has actually not been manipulated by the house.



- **How it works:** Before a round begins, the server generates a secret "server seed" and hashes it, showing the hash to the gamer. The player's internet browser creates a "client seed." When integrated with a nonce (a counter), these three aspects figure out the game outcome.
- **Confirmation:** After the round concludes, the unhashed server seed is revealed. Gamers can plug these variables into a confirmation tool to show the house didn't modify the outcome midway through.
