CoinFlip is a direct player-vs-player (PvP) game mode. 2 players wager skins of roughly equal monetary worth. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the entire pot, minus a little commission (home edge) taken by the site.

4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot game, several players toss skins into a main pot. Each skin contributes to the player's general portion chance of winning the entire pot (based on the dollar value of their contribution). A virtual spinner chooses a winning ticket, and one lucky gamer takes home all the deposited skins.
