When should homeowners schedule air conditioning maintenance to avoid refrigerant transition costs?

Refrigerant regulations are changing, and homeowners often hear about this but don't understand what it means in practical terms. The EPA has been phasing out R-22 refrigerant—the fluid that cools older AC systems—because it damages the ozone layer. By 2025, R-22 will be nearly impossible to find, and its price will skyrocket. If your system still uses R-22 and develops a leak, you'll face a choice: pay premium prices for rare refrigerant, switch to a new compatible fluid that may require system modifications, or replace the entire unit. Understanding this now, before an emergency forces your hand, is why timing your HVAC service matters so much this year. How does the R-22 to R-410A transition affect your repair timeline?

Your system's refrigerant type determines what you can do when trouble strikes. Most systems built after 2010 already use R-410A, a newer refrigerant that will eventually be phased out too—but not immediately. However, if your unit is older and still running on R-22, the window to make smart decisions is closing fast. Scheduling HVAC service during shoulder seasons—spring or fall—gives you time to source refrigerant at stable prices and plan next steps without pressure. Emergency calls in July or August, when temperatures exceed 100 degrees and every contractor is booked, force you into **hvac near me repair** urgent decisions with limited supply and higher labor costs. If your system needs refrigerant during peak season and R-22 is unavailable, you'll pay premium prices for whatever alternative is in stock. 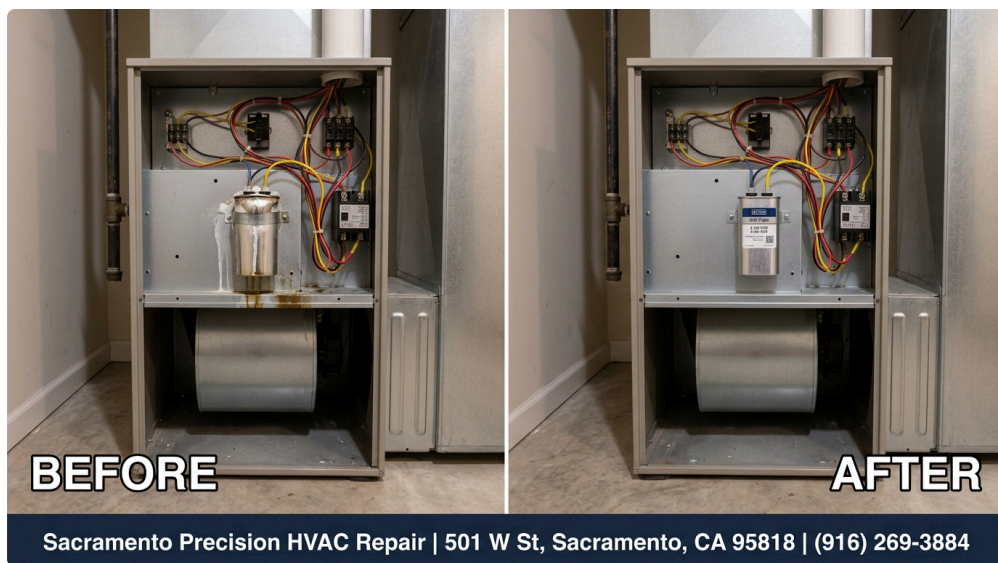
