- **Watch on the leaderboards:** Always know where you stand relative to the cut-off line.
- **Prevent stagnation:** If you are sitting in a certifying position with only two hands left, stop wagering big amounts. Safeguard the possession.
- **Aggressiveness when behind:** If you are outside the cash with three hands staying, basic bets will not conserve you. You must scale up your wagers to catch the leaders.
