The Door Glass Repair Process When homeowner decide to fix their door glass, understanding the actions involved helps demystify the task. While the exact process differs depending upon the kind of door (sliding glass, wood framed, steel, or aluminum),

stay consistent. 1. Security First Broken glass is naturally dangerous. Anyone handling the repair should use durable work gloves, protective eyeglasses, and closed-toe shoes. If the glass is totally shattered, laying down a tarpaulin or heavy plastic sheeting around the work

area captures falling shards. 2. Eliminating the Door Panel(If Applicable)For the majority of moving patio area doors or inset door panels, it is much simpler to work on the glass if the door is eliminated from its frame and laid flat on a workbench or saw-horses.
