- **Coinflip:** An easy 50/50 (or near it) head-to-head game where 2 gamers wager skins of equivalent value, and a virtual coin flip identifies the winner.
- **Jackpot:** Multiple players deposit skins into a communal pot. A winner is drawn arbitrarily, with higher-value deposits increasing a player's analytical chance of winning the whole pot.

While both include betting, CS2 gambling differs significantly from conventional online gambling in regards to currency, ease of access, and neighborhood combination.
