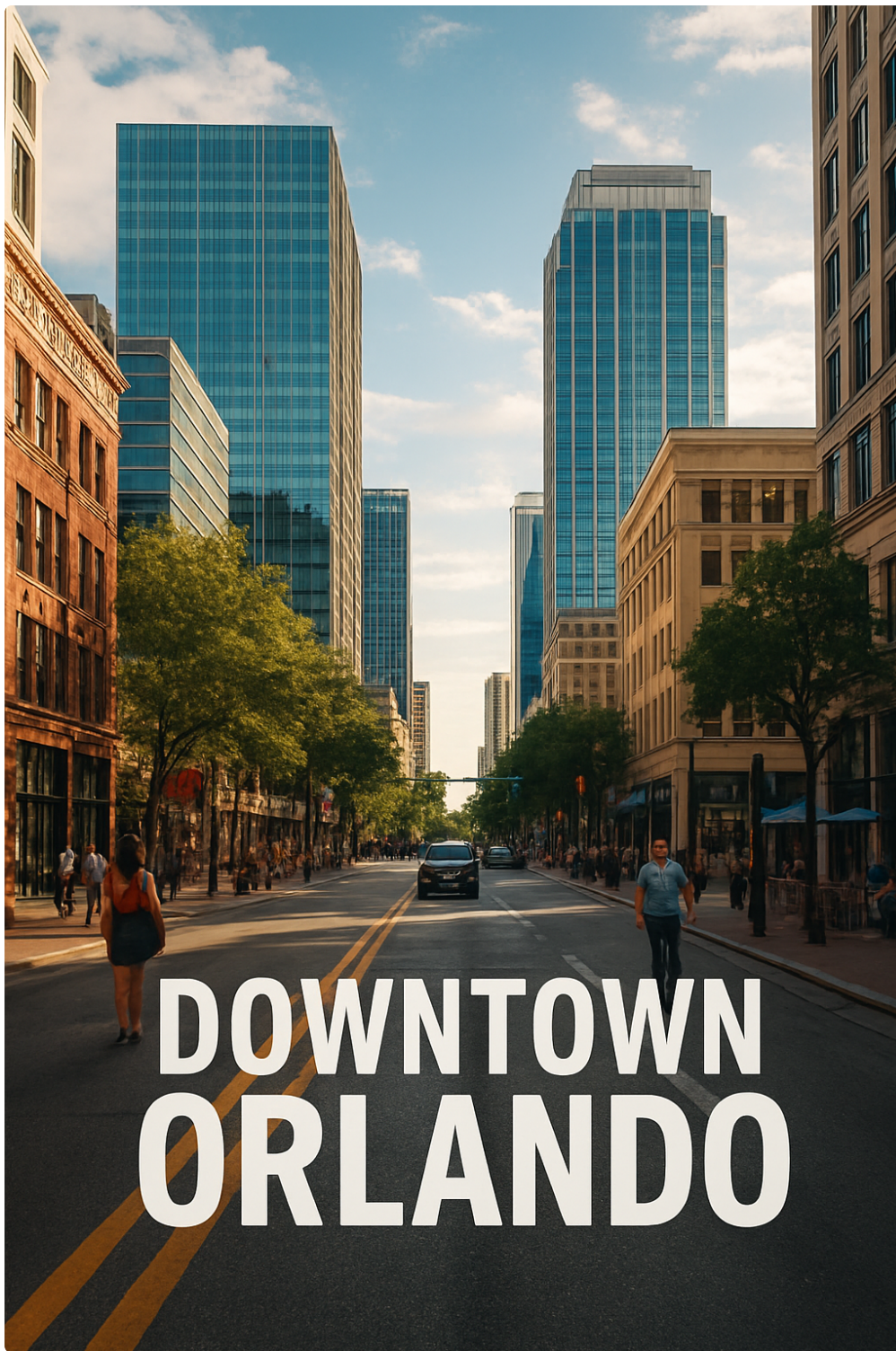
How on-site locksmith work fits Orlando
