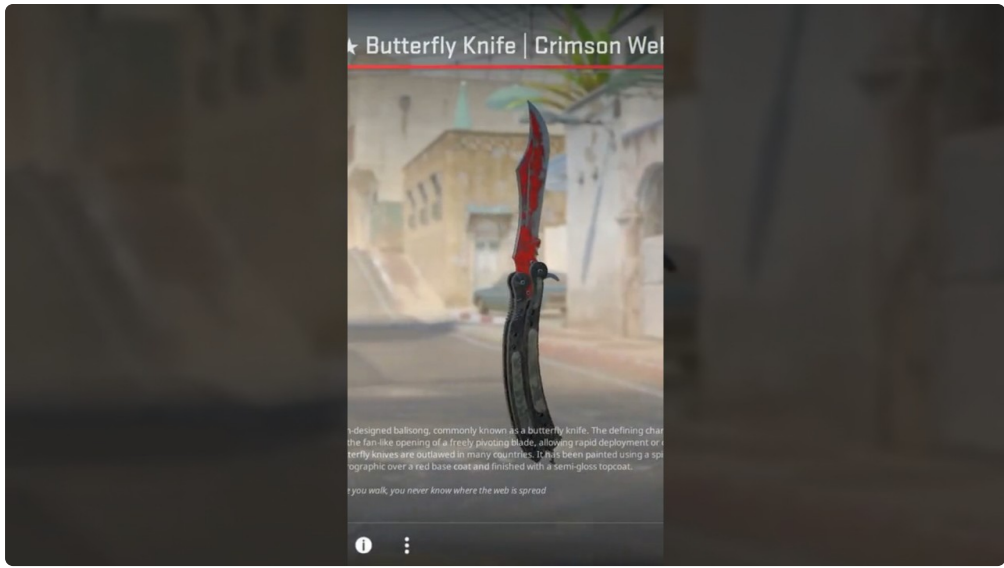
How Case Opening Works
