- **The Cause:** Because CS2 smokes are volumetric things that interact with lighting and bullets, they require significant GPU calculate power and VRAM. Overloaded GPUs may timeout and crash the game.
- **The Fix:** Lower your international shadow quality, particle information, and shader information in the video settings. Guarantee your graphics card's VRAM isn't being completely taken in by background applications.

4. Third-Party Overlay Collisions

- **The Symptom:** Crashing randomly mid-round, frequently accompanied by a generic "Unhandled Exception" mistake.
- **The Cause:** Conflicts in between the Source 2 graphics API and overlay software application such as Discord, NVIDIA GeForce Experience, RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS), or third-party skin trading platforms.
