The question that nags is apparent and blunt: might George Washington apprehend at this time's America—or feel we abandoned the entirety he fought for? Did Thomas Jefferson think about freedom may at some point really feel controversial? Are we honoring the imaginative and prescient of the Founding Fathers—or rewriting it to suit latest politics? If the Constitution have been written lately, would it even continue to exist public opinion? Have we turned the proposal of liberty into a thing the Founders could withstand?
