- **Active vs. Rare Drop Pools:** Valve frequently turns cases. Active cases drop regularly after matches, while older cases move into the "uncommon drop pool," implying they drop extremely infrequently (roughly a 1% possibility after a match), causing their market value to rise over time.

Every weapon skin and unique product inside a CS: GO case is appointed a specific rarity tier. These tiers dictate not only the visual style of the item but also the mathematical likelihood of unboxing it.

Additionally, every weapon skin dropped <https://cs2skin.com/cases> from a case includes a **Wear Rating** (Float Value), identifying its condition from *Factory New* to *Battle-Scarred*, together with an opportunity to be *StatTrak*™ (an integrated counter that tracks kills made with the weapon).

Over a decade of advancement, Valve released dozens of cases. Some ended up being famous due to the stellar collection of skins they introduced to the video game.

1. The CS: GO Weapon Case

Launched in 2013, this is where everything started. It presented iconic community-designed classics like the **AWP|Lightning Strike** and the original batch of knife finishes. Today, unopened versions of this case trade for hundreds of dollars.

2. Operation Bravo Case

Released alongside Operation Bravo, this case included the legendary **AK-47|Fire Serpent** and the **Desert Eagle|Cobalt Disruption**. It stays among the most popular collector products in the video game.

3. Chroma Case Series

Introduced in 2015, the Chroma cases brought brilliant, futuristic finishes to the video game and debuted new knife types, including the Karambit, M9 Bayonet, and Butterfly Knife versions with marble and Doppler surfaces.

4. Prisma Case Series

Known for presenting lively, vibrant skins like the **M4A4|Emperor** and the **Five-SeveN|Angry Mob**, Prisma cases likewise featured the Horizon knives with coveted surfaces like Emerald and Sapphire.
