- **Cease-and-Desist Letters:** Valve has occasionally provided legal cautions to significant betting operators, requiring lots of high-profile sites to close down or modify their service models.
- **API Restrictions:** Restrictions on how third-party services interact with user stocks have actually made unauthorized business operations harder to maintain.

In spite of these efforts, the environment remains resilient. When one major domain is required to close, others regularly emerge under new branding, adjusting to Valve's technical constraints.

Best Practices for Safety and Responsible Gaming
