3. The Reverse Martingale (Paroli)

- **How it works:** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, riding hot streaks while keeping losses minimal during cold streaks.
- **Threat Level:** Moderate. Requires discipline to leave after a few consecutive wins.
