- **The Martingale System:** A timeless betting method where a player doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recuperate all previous losses plus an earnings equal to the original base bet. Nevertheless, this needs a huge bankroll and can quickly strike site betting limits.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses decreased to the base bet amount.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the objective of claiming huge multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This functions much like playing the lottery game.
