

A faulty garage door can impact security, parking, daily routines, and getting into your home. Whether a garage door fails to open, the opener makes strange sounds, or a broken garage door spring leaves the door jammed, the best remedy depends on the failed component and the door's overall condition. What are the usual garage door problems?

A residential garage door contains several mobile and weight-supporting components. The overhead garage door itself may have broken sections, aged rollers, bent tracks, or broken cables. Photo-eye sensors near the bottom of the tracks are another common cause. These sensors must face each other and remain free of dust, leaves, or other objects. Incorrect limit settings can make the door move backward, stop short of the floor, or fail to close completely.

Why is the garage door noisy, crooked, or off track?

A noisy garage door may have dry hinges, worn garage door rollers, loose fasteners, or a stressed opener. Grinding, scraping, or popping sounds should not be ignored. They may indicate that the door is rubbing against the tracks or that a spring is breaking down.

A crooked door often indicates a broken torsion spring, worn extension springs, or a fault with the lift cables. The springs counterbalance the weight of the door, while the cables transfer force as the door moves. If a cable has slipped free or a spring has snapped, the door may become extremely heavy on one side.
