remain consistent. 1. Safety First Broken glass is inherently hazardous. Anyone managing the repair needs to use durable work gloves, protective eyewear, and closed-toe shoes. If the glass is totally shattered, putting down a tarpaulin or heavy plastic sheeting around the work

Eliminating the Door Panel(If Applicable)For most sliding patio doors or inset door panels, it is much easier to deal with the glass if the door is removed from its frame and laid flat on a workbench or saw-horses. Unlatch and lift sliding doors out of their tracks.

. 3. Removing Old Glass and Glazing For Wood/Metal Framed Doors: Remove the interior trim, stops, or glazing beads holding the glass in location. Carefully pry out any broken glass pieces. For Insulated Glass Units (IGUs): The entire sealed system is generally removed

- from the frame. Cleaning Residue: Scrape away old silicone, putty,

or double-sided glazing tape. Clean the rabbet(the recess where the glass sits) tidy so the brand-new glass will sit flush. 4. Measuring and Installing the Replacement Glass Precise measurements are critical.

- **Step the height, width, and thickness of the glass opening. Apply a fresh bead of silicone sealant or new**
- **glazing tape to the frame. Thoroughly set the new piece of glass into the opening, pushing carefully to develop a tight seal. Re-install the stops, beads, or trim to secure the glass in place.**
