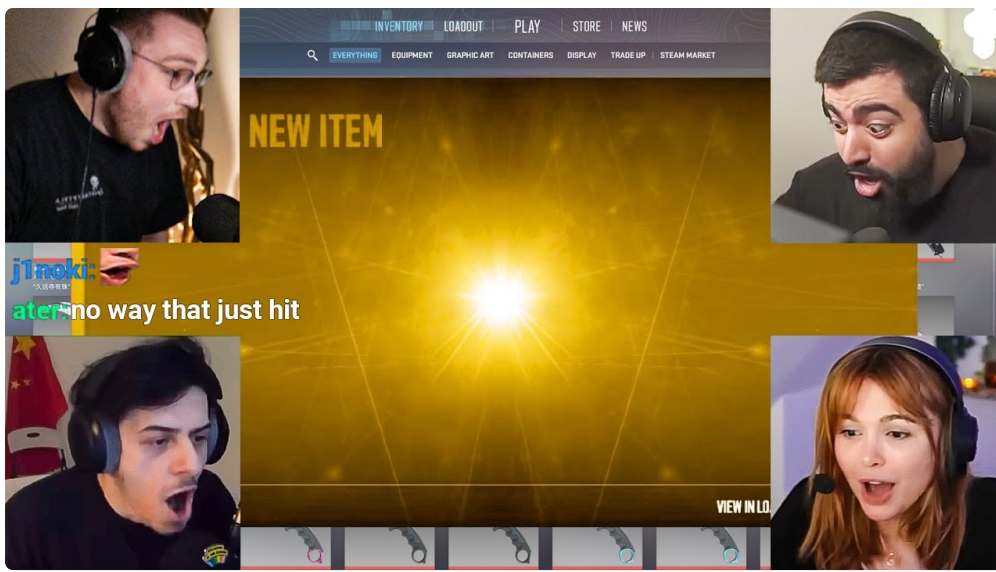
Threats and Safety Considerations
