I have walked through bathrooms with expensive stone, oversized showers, and custom cabinetry that still felt inconvenient because nobody thought through traffic flow or daily habits.

In a master bath, the shower usually carries the most weight. The dimensions need to fit the users comfortably, but size alone is not enough. The entry should be easy. The controls should be reachable without standing directly under cold water. Niches should be placed where bottles fit naturally without becoming visual clutter. If the shower has multiple heads, the plumbing system needs to support them. That sounds obvious, yet many people pick fixtures before confirming their home can deliver the pressure and volume needed.

Vanities deserve the same practical thinking. Shared vanities can work beautifully, but only if each person has enough real storage. Deep drawers often perform better than a maze of cabinet doors. Outlet placement matters more than homeowners realize, especially for toothbrush chargers, hair tools, or electric razors. Countertop edges, sink depth, and faucet reach all affect day to day use.
