4. Change the brief screw with a 3-inch wood screw. As you drive it in, it will anchor into the tough wall stud behind the door frame, pulling the top of the door back into alignment.

Removing Drafts

Drafty doors waste energy and let in insects.

1. Examine the door perimeter while closed on a bright day to see where light shines through.
2. Eliminate old, breakable weatherstripping from the door jamb.
3. Clean the surface area completely.
4. Step and cut new V-strip, foam tape, or rubber gasket weatherstripping to fit the top and sides of the frame.
5. Press or nail the brand-new product firmly into location.
