- **4. Utilize Lower-Cost Cases for Longevity**Instead of blowing your entire budget plan on a single battle featuring expensive cases (like Operation cases or Dreams & Nightmares), choose for less expensive cases to play more rounds. This lowers variation and extends your gaming session.
